

2020 Personal Income Tax Return Checklist

Office Update & Covid Procedures:

Tax Filing & Payment Deadlines

2020 appears to be business as usual for the Canada Revenue Agency. As such, we are not expecting any tax filing or payment extensions for 2020. We anticipate the following deadlines for 2020:

Self-employed individuals and their spouses

- Tax Payment Taxes to be paid (including HST) by April 30th
- Taxes Filed Taxes to be filed (including HST) by June 15th

Everyone Else

• Tax Filings & Payments – All due April 30th

The Canada Revenue Agency has indicated that they will provide **interest relief if you received Covid-19 benefits** (See information on CRA's website for specific criteria for this relief). This relief only applies to 2020 personal income tax amounts owing (not HST or other amounts) and provides for interest relief until April 30, 2022. Note that **late filing penalties still apply** and will be charged if your return is not filed by April 30th/June 15th 2020!

2020 & 2021 Personal Tax Rate

There has been no change to personal tax rates for 2020 and 2021. The only changes were normal inflationary increases to tax brackets.
